

Players Club of Swarthmore (PCS) COVID Policy

Updated August 25, 2022

The Players Club of Swarthmore continues to monitor local, state and federal guidance, along with practices of professional and community theaters, to do our best to keep everyone who enters our doors safe and healthy. To that end, the following policies have been put in place:

For Patrons

For those attending performances at the Players Club, the wearing of masks while in the building is encouraged but optional. All patrons attending a performance at PCS must provide proof of up-to-date vaccination against COVID-19 to enter the building. Physical cards or photos of vaccinations records are both accepted. Additionally, guests over the age of 18 must provide an additional form of identification. For details on what “up-to-date vaccination” means, see the definition at the bottom of this policy.

Patrons unable to provide proof of “fully vaccinated” status must provide proof of at least one of the following: a negative COVID-19 PCR test taken within 72 hours of the performance start time; or a negative COVID-19 rapid antigen test taken within 6 hours of the performance start time. Pictures of negative home tests with the date of the performance written on them will be accepted. Guests over the age of 18 must provide an additional form of identification.

We urge you to stay home if you are experiencing any respiratory difficulty or other symptom that could be COVID-19. You will receive not only a cheerful refund or exchange, but also our thanks for helping keep your fellow patrons safe.

For Performers, Volunteers and Staff

All performers and staff must provide proof of up-to-date vaccination against COVID-19 to participate in a production, and acknowledge their vaccination status and the risks associated with COVID-19, along with adherence to our harassment and working with minors policies, by signing our [volunteer acknowledgement form](#).

In General

We encourage casts to minimize unnecessary intermingling by using separate entrances as both a safety precaution and a courtesy to not interrupt ongoing work. We will continue to monitor the spread of COVID-19 and review our guidelines and policies accordingly, and will communicate any changes to you as soon as we can. Thank you for your cooperation with these measures designed to keep us all safe.

Vaccination Policy Details

“Up-to-date” on vaccination means that the performance date selected to attend must be at least 14 days after any patron’s second dose of an FDA- or WHO-authorized two-dose COVID-19 vaccine (e.g., Pfizer or Moderna), or at least 14 days after any patron’s single dose of an FDA- or WHO-authorized single dose COVID-19 vaccine (e.g., Johnson & Johnson). Those who are 6 months removed from their second dose are encouraged to get booster shots, but they are not required for entry at this time.
